


Please follow all directions carefully for an accurate measurement.

IMPORTANT: Before printing the ring sizer, please check your print out using the following directions:

- 1. Page scaling must be set to "NONE" in your printer settings.
- 2. Measure the bar on the right to confirm that it is exactly 50mm, or 2 inches long.
- 3. If measurement is inaccurate, check your printer settings and repeat these directions.



Option A - Paper Ring Sizer



- Print and cut out ring sizer below. Cut a small slit where indicated at the thicker end.
- 2. Slip the pointed end of the ring sizer through the slit.
- 3. Slide sizer past knuckle and tightly secure around the base of your finger.
- 4. The number that appears where it says "Read Size Here" is your approximate ring size.

Option B - Measure an Existing Ring



- 1. Select a ring from your current jewelry collection.
- 2. Place the ring on a circle within the chart below, matching the **inside edge** of the ring to the circle closest in size.
- 3. Should the size fall between two circles, order the larger size.

Note: The "ring finger" is located between the pinky finger and middle finger. Engagement and wedding rings are typically worn on this finger.
